

The Drop-in Centre

The Drop-in service has developed as an integral part of the Community Facilitation service provided by Western Care Association in the Castlebar area.

The Drop-in was developed in 2001 when a small group of people who live and work independently in the community decided they would like to meet others in a similar situation to themselves. The purpose behind this was to exchange information regarding areas of concern in their lives and for social opportunities.

The Drop-in centre, as the name suggests, is a place for people to "drop in" for a chat or to seek support with anything that may be worrying them. Areas addressed can range from entitlements, rights, housing, relationships, health, loneliness, isolation, poverty, personal safety, social inclusion - basically anything that the person identifies they need support with.

People are encouraged to partake in groups and classes based in the community like literacy, art, drama, creative writing and computer classes. This provides people with the opportunity to make new friends, be part of their community and also make a positive contribution to the community.

There are a number of activities organised at weekends when people are at a loose end. These can range from art, relaxation, music, cookery and drama. These activities are suggested by the people who avail of the service.

Saturday 2.00 - 4.00pm
Sunday 3.00 - 5.00pm

Shopping trips, weekends away, city breaks and sun holidays are all part and parcel of the drop-in service. We fundraise for these breaks in a variety of ways from raffles, women's mini marathon, bucket collections, cake sales, car boot sales, anyway that will help make breaks away more affordable for people.

The Drop-in also facilitates a number of groups. These are in response to people's needs and include group work on self esteem, stress management, assertiveness, health and well being, relationships, sexuality and self advocacy. We work along with the Health Promotion Unit and Mayo VEC in providing these workshops.

We also organise both women and men's groups. These groups use their time together to talk about things that are difficult to address in a mixed group. Occasionally we have experts in to address specific areas of interest like health & sexuality.

We work towards securing affordable and safe accommodation for the people who avail of the service and have developed a good working relationship with local landlords, together with Mayo County Council and Castlebar Town Council.

What is Community Facilitation?

- It is a confidential person centred service.
- We provide support to adults with learning disabilities living independently in the community and also support individuals who are moving towards independent living.
- We work hand in hand with people availing of the service so that we can offer an individualised, positive, original and innovative service thereby meeting the needs of the individual.
- We enable people to address key areas of their lives, e.g., loneliness, isolation, poverty, relationships, sexuality, personal safety, rights, social inclusion, housing and health.
- We do this through exploring a variety of options, i.e., 1:1 sessions, group work, liaising within and outside the organisation.

Expenditure

Monies raised through the annual Door-to-Door collection are spent on our houses and buildings throughout the county, and on the provision of minibuses, educational aids and equipment, and furnishings to support the provision of services. At present Western Care Association provides services through our 43 homes and respite houses, 18 resource centres, and supports to the education system. We provide a door-to-door transport service between home and our centres through the use of 27 minibuses, a large number of which are wheelchair accessible, and we also provide MPV's for use in our services, with a total of 32 now in use throughout the county.

During 2007, we plan to undertake the following capital developments :

- The provision of new houses in Manulla and Kilmoeve.
- Renovations to a number of our buildings throughout the county.
- Purchase of new minibuses and MPV's to upgrade and maintain our transport fleet throughout the county.
- Provision of a range of lifting equipment and other aids and appliances for use in our houses and centres.

Through your continued contributions to the Door-to-Door collection, we are in a position to provide and expand our service provision throughout the county, and we thank you most sincerely for this.
